For Domestic and those International students not required to complete the English Language Enhancement course

For the award of *Bachelor of Psychological Science (BPsychSc)*, you must successfully complete 240 credit points, made up of:

- 160 credit points for the core module
- 80 credit points for the flexible module

For International students required to complete the English Language Enhancement course

For the award of *Bachelor of Psychological Science (BPsychSc)*, you must successfully complete 240 credit points, made up of:

- 160 credit points for the core module
- 10 credit points for the English Language Enhancement course (5902LHS)
- 70 credit points for the flexible module

Other program requirements

You must successfully complete:

- no more than 100 credit points of Level 1 courses (the first digit of a course code denotes the level);
- at least 60 credit points of Level 3 courses or higher.

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.

Honours

A fourth year of study that leads to the **Bachelor of Psychological Science (Honours) (2004)** is available to students who meet the specified requirements for admission to the Honours program.

English Language Enhancement
