For Domestic and those International students not required to complete the English Language Enhancement course

For the award of *Bachelor of Political Science and International Relations/Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice (BPoliSciIntRel/BCCJ)*, you must successfully complete 320 credit points, made up of the core courses AND

- 60 credit points for the International Relations major or Political Science and Public Policy major or Security, Conflict and Human Rights major; AND
- 30 credit points of free-choice electives.

For International students required to complete the English Language Enhancement Course

For the award of *Bachelor of Political Science and International Relations/Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice (BPoliSciIntRel/BCCJ)*, you must successfully complete 320 credit points, made up of the core courses AND

- 10 credit points for the English Language Enhancement course (5904LHS), AND
- 60 credit points for the International Relations major or Political Science and Public Policy major or Security, Conflict and Human Rights major; AND
- 20 credit points of free-choice electives.

Other program requirements

You must successfully complete:

- no more than 120 credit points of Level 1 courses (the first digit of a course code denotes the level);
- at least 60 credit points of Level 3 courses or higher.

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.
