The Graduate Certificate in International Tourism and Hospitality Management is offered full-time and part-time at the Gold Coast campus. This program is also offered online.

You may choose to study courses at other campuses, online or a combination of both or where the program structure allows.

Students may take a reduced study load. You will be classed as a part-time student if you enrol in less than 30 credit points per trimester.

What are the fees?

Commonwealth supported students

 contribution bands). A student's actual annual fee may vary in accordance with his or her choice of majors and
 electives. The Australian Government sets student contribution amounts on an annual basis.

Fee-paying postgraduate (domestic) students

Indicative annual tuition fee

The indicative annual tuition fee is calculated based on a standard full-time study load which is usually 80 credit points.

The indicative annual tuition fee is based on current conditions and available data and should only be used as a guide. These fees are reviewed annually and are subject to change.

Tuition fees

- A fee-paying postgraduate student pays tuition fees.
- Students are liable for tuition fees for the courses they are enrolled in as at the census date.
- The tuition fee for students who commence their program prior to 2014 is charged according to the approved program
 fee for the trimester in which the student commenced the program.
- The tuition fee for students who commence their program from 2014 onwards is charged according to the approved program fee for the trimester in which the student is enrolled.

Additional fee information

This postgraduate program has Commonwealth Supported Places. If you are eligible, the Australian Government will contribute to the cost of this program but you will also be required to make a contribution. Quotas are applied for admission to the Commonwealth Supported Places. Where demand exceeds the number of available places and all places have been filled for the current admission period, applicants who meet minimum program entry requirements may be eligible for a Fee-Paying Postgraduate place if such places are available. Please note that deferrals are not permitted for programs with Commonwealth Supported Places.
