Admission to the Bachelor of Contemporary Australian Indigenous Art is via portfolio and interview. To be considered for admission applicants must apply and submit their portfolio to Griffith University.

Applications for admission to this program are made through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC). Non-recent school leavers may submit a direct application via First Peoples Direct Admission.

Portfolios are submitted directly to Griffith, with all details available on the QCAD Portfolio Admission webpage.
