Degree requirements: Students who started OUA - Study Period 3 - 2022

To be eligible for the award of *Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice (BCCJ)*, a student must complete 24 units as prescribed below:

- at least eight units must be Griffith University units studied at second or third year level
- completion of eight units at first year level in Criminology and Criminal Justice
- completion of five compulsory Criminology and Criminal Justice units
- completion of eight units from the Criminal Justice Major
- at least six units in the degree must be at third year level
- completion of three elective units
- students must not study more than 10 units at first year level
- students must complete this degree within 8 years.

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.
