## How to apply

#### Admission requirements

#### Academic entry requirements (by country)

Academic entry requirements apply to International applicants for this program. You can view the academic entry requirements for this program [here](#).

Applicants are required to attend an audition where their abilities in acting, voice and speech, movement and group singing will be assessed.

#### Language requirements

English language requirements apply to International applicants and other applicants whose previous study was undertaken in a language other than English. The minimum English language requirements for such applicants for entry to these programs are described [below](#).

### What is the application process?

#### How to apply

An international student is a person who is not Australian citizen, a New Zealand citizen, a Pacific Engagement visa holder or the holder of a permanent resident/humanitarian visa.

This program is available to International students for **study in Australia at Griffith University**.

International students applying to study on-campus in Australia will require a student visa or another type of visa which does not preclude them from studying in Australia.

There is no deadline for International applicants making an application with a recorded audition. However, it is advisable to apply by 31 October for entry in the following year.

### What are the language requirements?

#### Language requirements

English language requirements apply to International applicants and other applicants whose previous study was undertaken in a language other than English. The minimum English language requirements for such applicants for entry to this program are as

follows:

- A minimum overall band score of 7.0 on IELTS (Academic) with no sub-score of less than 6.5
- *OR* a minimum score of 580 on TOEFL
- *OR* an internet-based (iBT) TOEFL score of 92 (no score less than 22)
- *OR* no score less than 4 in each skill of the ISLPR (conducted by ISLPR Language Services only)
- *OR* a minimum overall score of 185 (no score less than 176) on C2 Proficiency (formerly Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English)
- *OR* an overall score of 65 in the Pearson Test of English (Academic) with no score less than 58.

English test results must be no more than two years old.

The Direct Entry Program (DEP) pathway is not accepted for this program.

The above requirements are **HIGHER** than the requirements stipulated in University policy. Applicants should refer to the following procedure for further information:

The requirement to demonstrate an IELTS (Academic) of 7.0 or an equivalent level of proficiency in English will apply to all International students with the exception of those students who are admitted via one of the following English admission pathways which are exempt from the completion of the English language enhancement course:

- Satisfactory completion of one of the qualifications specified in the following schedule:

- Satisfactory completion within the past five years of **at least two years full-time equivalent** of post-secondary, higher education sector accredited associate degree or degree level study or equivalent in a country specified in the above Schedule A in which the language of instruction and assessment/examination for the entire two years was in English.
- Satisfactory completion within the past five years (from Canada [excluding Quebec], New Zealand, Australia, Republic of Ireland, United States or United Kingdom) of senior secondary, post-secondary, higher education sector accredited associate degree or degree level study or equivalent for **at least two years full-time equivalent**.
