- 10 credit points for an Employability elective course; AND
- 30 credit points of free-choice electives.

For the award of *Bachelor of Government and International Relations/Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice (BGovIntRel/BCCJ)*, you must successfully complete 320 credit points, made up of the core courses AND

- 10 credit points for the English Language Enhancement course (5904LHS); AND
- 60 credit points for the International Relations major or Politics and Public Policy major; AND
- 10 credit points for an Employability elective course AND
- 20 credit points of free-choice electives.

Other program requirements

You must successfully complete:

- no more than 120 credit points of Level 1 courses (the first digit of a course code denotes the level);
- at least 60 credit points of Level 3 courses or higher.

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.

The Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice and the Bachelor of Government and International Relations are accredited as an AQF Level 7 - Bachelor Degree.
