Admission requirements

The University's [Admission Policy](#) will apply.

To be eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Urban and Environmental Planning (Honours)/Bachelor of Science, you must have:

- A minimum overall Grade Point Average (GPA) of 5.5 for the courses listed in Years 2 and 3 of the [Bachelor of Urban and Environmental Planning/Bachelor of Science \(1512\)](#) or [Bachelor of Urban and Environmental Planning/Bachelor of Science \(1516\)](#).
- Completion of 4029ENV Project Proposal for Honours, a mandatory course for the [Bachelor of Urban and Environmental Planning \(Honours\) \(1432\)](#).

Language requirements

Eligible students may apply for this Honours program up to and including Trimester 1-2025. From Trimester 1-2026, commencing students are referred to the [Bachelor of Urban Planning \(Honours\)/Bachelor of Science \(1660\)](#).

Before lodging your application via an [online internal transfer](#), you will need to consult with prospective supervisors and discuss possible topics for your Honours dissertation.

What are the language requirements?

Language requirements

English language requirements apply to International applicants and other applicants whose previous study was undertaken in a language other than English. The minimum English language requirements for such applicants for entry to this program are as follows:

- A minimum overall band score of 6.5 on IELTS (Academic) with no sub-score of less than 6.0
- *OR* a minimum score of 575 on TOEFL
- *OR* an internet-based (iBT) TOEFL score of 79 (no sub-score less than 19)
- *OR* no score less than 3+ in each skill of the ISLPR (conducted by ISLPR Language Services only)
- *OR* a minimum overall score of 176 (no score less than 169) on C1 Advanced (formerly Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English) **or** C2 Proficiency (formerly Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English)
- *OR* an overall score of 58 in the Pearson Test of English (Academic) with no score less than 50.

English test results must be no more than two years old.

International students who successfully complete the [Direct Entry Program \(DEP\)](#) will satisfy the English Language requirements for this Griffith degree.

The Direct Entry Program (DEP) is not available for Domestic students.
