- 60 credit points for a second major and 20 credit points of foundation and/or Listed/Undergraduate free-choice elective courses **or**
- 80 credit points for an extended major, **or**
- 80 credit points of listed electives and/or Undergraduate free-choice elective/s

For International students required to complete the English Language Enhancement Course

For the award of *Bachelor of Political Science and International Relations (BPoliSciIntRel)*, you must successfully complete 240 credit points, made up of the core courses AND

10 credit points for the English Language Enhancement course (5904LHS), **AND** 60 credit points for the International Relations major or Political Science and Public Policy major or Security, Conflict and Human Rights major, **AND**

- 60 credit points for a second major and 10 credit points of foundation courses or Listed/Undergraduate free-choice elective/s, **or**
- 70 credit points of listed and/or Undergraduate free-choice elective/s

Other program requirements

You must successfully complete:

- no more than 100 credit points of Level 1 courses (the first digit of a course code denotes the level);
- at least 60 credit points of Level 3 courses or higher.

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.
