### Degree requirements: Students who started Trimester 1 - 2025

For the award of *Bachelor of Cyber Security / Bachelor of Criminology & Criminal Justice (BCybSec/BCCJ)*, you must successfully complete 320 credit points, made up of:

- 320 credit points for the Core Module

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.

### Other program requirements

You must successfully complete:

- no more than 120 credit points of Level 1 courses (the first digit of a course code denotes the level);
- at least 60 credit points of Level 3 courses or higher.

All undergraduate International students are required to complete an **English Language Enhancement Course** unless specific criteria are met as specified in Section 5.0 [Qualifications Procedure](#).
