How to apply

Can I apply?

Admission requirements

The University's [Admission Policy](#) will apply.

The criteria for admission to this Honours program are:

- successful completion of the [Bachelor of Pharmacy \(1395\)](#) or an equivalent qualification;
- a GPA of at least 5.0 over the second, third and fourth year of the bachelor degree (excluding clinical placement courses).

The Program Director will take the following into consideration when assessing applications for admission:

- the suitability of the proposed dissertation topic;
- the resources available to support the candidature including availability of appropriate supervision;
- the preparedness of the applicant to undertake the degree in terms of the elapsed time since the prospective candidate qualified for the award of a bachelor degree and the academic preparation provided by the bachelor degree for the candidate's proposed dissertation topic.

Language requirements

English language requirements apply to International applicants and other applicants whose previous study was undertaken in a language other than English. The minimum English language requirements for such applicants for entry to these programs are described [below](#).

Credit and recognition of prior learning

What is the application process?

How to apply

An international student is a person who is not Australian citizen, a New Zealand citizen, a Pacific Engagement visa holder or the holder of a permanent resident/humanitarian visa.

This program is available to International students for **study in Australia at Griffith University**.

International students applying to study on-campus in Australia will require a student visa or another type of visa which does not preclude them from studying in Australia.

What are the language requirements?

Language requirements

English language requirements apply to International applicants and other applicants whose previous study was undertaken in a language other than English.

The minimum English language requirements for such applicants for entry to these programs are as follows:

- A minimum overall band score of 7.0 on IELTS (Academic) with no sub-score of less than 6.5
- *OR* a minimum score of 580 on TOEFL
- *OR* an internet-based (iBT) TOEFL score of 92 (no score less than 22)
- *OR* no score less than 4 in each skill of the ISLPR (conducted by ISLPR Language Services only)
- *OR* a minimum overall score of 185 (no score less than 176) on C2 Proficiency (formerly Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English)
- *OR* an overall score of 65 in the Pearson Test of English (Academic) with no score less than 58.

English test results must be no more than two years old.

The Direct Entry Program (DEP) pathway is not accepted for this program.

The above requirements are HIGHER than the requirements stipulated in University policy. Applicants should refer to this procedure for exceptions to these overall requirements:

The requirement to demonstrate an IELTS (Academic) of 7.0 or an equivalent level of proficiency in English will apply to all International students with the exception of those students who are admitted via one of the following English admission pathways which are exempt from the completion of the English language enhancement course:

- Satisfactory completion of one of the qualifications specified in the following schedule:
 - [English Language Proficiency Schedule](#)
- Satisfactory completion within the past five years of **at least two years full-time equivalent** of post-secondary, higher education sector accredited associate degree or degree level study or equivalent in a country specified in the above Schedule A in which the language of instruction and assessment/examination for the entire two years was in English.
- Satisfactory completion within the past five years (from Canada [excluding Quebec], New Zealand, Australia, Republic of Ireland, United States or United Kingdom) of senior secondary, post-secondary, higher education sector accredited associate degree or degree level study or equivalent for **at least two years full-time equivalent**.

Can I apply for credit?

Credit and recognition of prior learning
