Degree requirements: Students who started Trimester 3 - 2024

To be eligible for the award of *Master of International Business (MIntBus)*, a student must successfully complete 120 credit points including:

- 60 credit points for core courses AND
- 60 credit points for electives OR
 - 20 credit points for electives **and** 10 credit points for the research methodology course **and** 30 credit points for the dissertation courses.

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.

Exit point

To be eligible to exit the Master of International Business program with the **Graduate Certificate in International Business** award, a student must successfully complete 40 credit points of core courses.

To exit, a student should apply for a program transfer.

Exit point: Graduate Certificate in International Business (3102). To exit (after successfully completing 40 credit points from the above core courses), a student should apply for a program transfer. Students articulating from the Graduate Certificate in International Business (3102) complete the remaining core courses, which have not already been successfully completed within their Graduate Certificate program.

Students should advise the Program Director about their intention to enrol in Dissertation component at least one trimester in advance of their expected enrolment.

Eligibility to undertake the **30 credit points of Dissertation courses** will be determined by the Program Director and will also be subject to the following criteria:

- completion of 60 credit points of core courses;
- achievement of a minimum GPA of 5.5 across these courses;
- the suitability of the proposed dissertation topic and the resources available to support the candidature including availability of appropriate supervision;
- lodged a completed *Nomination of Dissertation Topic and Supervisor* form.
