Degree requirements: Students who started Trimester 2 - 2023

To be eligible for the award of *Master of International Relations (MIntRel)*, a student must successfully complete 120 credit points including:

- minimum 60 credit points for the core courses; and
- maximum 60 credit points of listed elective courses OR
- maximum of 10 credit points of listed elective courses and 50 credit points of dissertation courses.

To be eligible for the award of *Master of International Relations (MIntRel)*, students admitted with 40 credit points of advanced standing must acquire 80 credit points including:

- minimum 20 credit points for the core courses; and
- maximum 60 credit points of listed elective OR
- maximum of 10 credit points of listed elective courses and 50 credit points of dissertation courses.

This degree may be awarded with Distinction where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur. This qualification is accredited as an AQF Level 9 - Masters Degree (Coursework).

Dissertation courses

Students should advise the Program Director about their intention to enrol in dissertation courses at least one trimester in advance of their expected enrolment.

Eligibility to undertake the Dissertation will be determined by the Program Director and will be subject to the following criteria:

- attained a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 5.5 across the core courses and
- lodged a completed **Nomination of Dissertation Topic and Supervisor form** and
- the suitability of the proposed dissertation topic and the resources available to support the candidature including availability of appropriate supervision.
