Degree requirements: Students who started Trimester 2 - 2024

To be eligible for the award of Master of Social Work (MSocWk/)/Master of Mental Health Practice (MMentHPrac), a student must acquire 240 credit points as prescribed below:

- Generalist Practice pathway:
 - gain 240 credit points for core courses.
- Dissertation pathway:
 - o gain 210 credit points for core courses and
 - gain 30 credit points for the research dissertation courses.

Note: Students commence in the Generalist Practice pathway and can transfer to the Dissertation pathway when the following eligibility criteria have been successfully met:

- completion of 7060HSV Foundations of Social Work Practice;
- achievement of a GPA of at least 5.5 for all completed courses;
- achievement of a Grade of at least 5 in 7001HSV Foundations of Research Inquiry or equivalent research course;
- the suitability of the proposed dissertation topic;
- the resources available to support the candidature including availability of appropriate supervision.

Exit point

To be eligible to exit the Master of Social Work with the Graduate Certificate in Social Care (3397) a student must complete 7060HSV Foundations of Social Work Practice and 20 credit points from prescribed courses.

To be eligible to exit the Master of Social Work with the Graduate Diploma of Social Care (4208) a student must complete 7060HSV Foundations of Social Work Practice and 60 credit points from prescribed courses.

To exit, a student should apply for a program transfer.

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.

The courses listed below are designated for the purpose of the *Academic Standing, Progressing and Exclusion Policy*. A student who fails a designated course will be subject to review by the Griffith Health Assessment Board and may be excluded from the program.
