Degree requirements: Students who started Trimester 1 - 2025

To be eligible for the award of *Master of Applied Behaviour Analysis (MAppBehAnalysis)*, a student must acquire 120 credit points as prescribed below:

- **Standard pathway:**
 - gain 80 credit points for core courses;
 - gain 40 credit points for listed elective courses.
- **Dissertation pathway:**
 - gain 80 credit points for core courses;
 - gain 40 credit points for dissertation courses.

To be eligible for the award of *Master of Applied Behaviour Analysis (MAppBehAnalysis)*, a student admitted with **40 credit points of advanced standing** must acquire 80 credit points as prescribed below:

- **Standard pathway:**
 - gain 40 credit points for core courses;
 - gain 40 credit points for listed elective courses.
- **Dissertation pathway:**
 - gain 40 credit points for core courses;
 - gain 40 credit points for the dissertation.

This degree may be awarded **with Distinction** where a student achieves a minimum program GPA of 6.5 with no failed courses. The words "This award was achieved with Distinction" will be recorded on the testamur.
