Can I apply? Admission requirements

What are the language requirements?

Language requirements

English language requirements apply to applicants whose previous study was undertaken in a language other than English. The minimum English language requirements for such applicants for entry to this program are as follows:

- A minimum overall band score of 7.0 on IELTS (Academic) with no sub-score of less than 7.0
- *OR* an internet-based (iBT) TOEFL score of 94 with the following minimum scores in each section of the test:

• 24 for listening | 24 for reading | 27 for writing | 23 for speaking

- *OR* a minimum overall score of 65 in the Pearson Test of English (Academic) with a minimum score of 65 in each of the four communicative skills (listening, reading, writing and speaking)
- *OR* the Occupational English Test (OET) with a minimum score of B in each of the four components (listening, reading, writing and speaking).

English test results must be no more than two years old.

The Direct Entry Program (DEP) pathway is not accepted for this program.
